



Joint Enabling Capabilities Command

The U.S. Transportation Command (USTRANSCOM) Joint Enabling Capabilities Command (JECC) provides mission-tailored, joint capability packages to combatant commanders in order to facilitate rapid establishment of joint force headquarters, fulfill Global Response Force (GRF) execution and bridge joint operational requirements.

The JECC consists of three subordinate joint commands which provide flexible, expeditionary joint operational and theater strategic planners, public affairs and communications experts who are experienced in complex joint operations.

The JECC subordinate joint commands are:

- **Joint Planning Support Element (JPSE)**, which provides rapidly deployable, tailored teams of joint planners for operational and strategic headquarters with expertise to accelerate the formation and increase the effectiveness of a joint force headquarters during emerging operations.
- **Joint Communications Support Element (JCSE)**, which provides rapidly deployable, scalable, en-route and early entry communications capabilities across the full spectrum of operations in order to enable rapid action of the joint force in support of the geographic combatant commands or other agencies as directed by the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.
- **Joint Public Affairs Support Element (JPASE)**, which provides ready, rapidly deployable joint public affairs support to facilitate establishment of joint force headquarters, bridge joint public affairs requirements and conduct effective training in order to meet current and emerging information environments.

The JECC is headquartered in Norfolk, Va. along with JPSE and JPASE. JCSE is located in Tampa, Fla., As a team, the JECC delivers unmatched joint operational command and control enablers to joint force commanders conducting emergent full spectrum operations.

The JECC's subordinate joint commands operate and train regularly with all geographic combatant commands, maintain cross-domain awareness and bring recent experience to rapidly evolving operational environments. The JECC's subordinate elements are highly adaptable and can be tailored in size and capability. Their performance in peacetime and in war has ensured that the JECC is the trusted enabler of joint command and control capabilities in complex operational environments.

By consistently delivering a high value product to the joint force, the JECC has become the Department of Defense's principal source of rapidly deployable joint planning, public affairs and communications professionals trained to enhance a joint force commander's capacity to command and control joint operations. JECC operational support can be received through GRF requests, the Request for Forces process or requests by General Officers/Flag Officers. JECC exercise support can be requested through the Joint Training Information Management System.
