

## Joint Enabling Capabilities Command

---

The Joint Enabling Capabilities Command (JECC), a subordinate joint command of U.S. Transportation Command (USTRANSCOM), provides mission-tailored, joint capability packages to combatant commanders in order to facilitate the rapid establishment of joint force headquarters, fulfill Global Response Force execution and bridge joint operational requirements.

The JECC consists of three subordinate joint commands — the Joint Planning Support Element (JPSE), the Joint Communications Support Element (JCSE) and the Joint Public Affairs Support Element (JPASE) — which provide flexible, expeditionary joint operational and theater strategic planners, communications and public affairs experts who are experienced in complex joint operations.

As a team, the JECC delivers unmatched joint operational command and control enablers to joint force commanders conducting emergent full spectrum operations.

By consistently delivering a high value product to the joint force, the JECC has become the Department of Defense's principal source of rapidly deployable joint planning, public affairs and communications professionals trained to enhance a joint force commander's capacity to command and control joint operations.

The JECC's subordinate joint commands operate and train regularly with all geographic combatant commands, maintain cross-domain awareness and bring recent experience to rapidly evolving operational environments. The JECC's subordinate elements are highly adaptable and can be tailored in size and capability. Their performance in peacetime and in war has ensured that the JECC is the trusted enabler of joint command and control capabilities in complex operational environments.

## Joint Planning Support Element
