Joint Public Affairs Support Element

The Joint Public Affairs Support Element (JPASE) provides ready, rapidly deployable joint public affairs support to facilitate establishment of joint force headquarters, bridge joint communication requirements and conduct effective training in order to meet current and emerging information environments.

JPASE is a unique Department of Defense (DoD) joint communication command. Headquartered in Norfolk, Va., JPASE personnel are the first communicators on the ground, establishing PA and communication infrastructures, processes and products. JPASE support can be received through Global Response Force requests, the Request for Forces process, or requests by General Officers/Flag Officers.

JPASE provides PA subject matter experts for Joint Staff support of combatant command exercises. JPASE planners support the Joint Exercise Lifecycle through training objectives and Commander's communication strategy development. As part of the Joint Exercise Control Group, JPASE personnel simulate the dynamic information environment by replicating media organizations, social media entities and PA functions at various levels of DoD/government. JPASE exercise support can be requested through the Joint Training Information Management System.
